Toll-free Environmental Hotline

Call 877-ask-emap for confidential assistance with your environmental questions. The hotline is staffed weekdays, 9am - 5pm, with voice mail at all other times. Foreign language assistance is available.

Consulting Assistance

Receive one-on-one consulting assistance with:

- Environmental regulatory requirements
- Permit applications, forms and plans
- Environmental management strategies
- Energy efficiency and waste minimization
- Finding sources of financing for environmental upgrades
- Health and safety requirements

Site Visits

Professional staff are available to visit your facility to assist with compliance issues and look for energy saving and waste minimization opportunities.
